Pledge

Pledge of Allegiance

Mayor Ervin asked everyone present to join in saying the Pledge of Allegiance.

Call to Order

1. Roll Call

The City Council of Newton, Iowa met in regular session at 6:00 P.M. on the above date in the Council Chambers at 101 West 4th Street South. Mayor Ervin presided. Present Council Members: Roth (via telephone), Dalton (via telephone), Hallam, Simbro, Holschuh. Absent: Mills.

Presentation

2. Jasper County Conservation - Keri Van Zante, Director

Keri provided an informative overview of the programs, facilities, and recreational opportunities available through Jasper County Conservation. She highlighted the many ways residents and visitors can enjoy and learn about the outdoors, including kayaking, hiking, hunting areas, nature play areas, and conservation activities. Keri also shared information about the department's Fall Fest and other community events, as well as classroom and educational programs that provide opportunities for children and families to learn about nature, wildlife, and conservation.

3. The Well - Dave Woodcock, Chief Ministry Officer

Dave provided an overview of the mission and services. The Well is a community ministry focused on meeting people where they are, providing support and stability. Dave discussed the need for additional resources, including a resource center that would work directly with individuals to provide education, guidance, and long-term support. The Well's approach centers on support, stability, and shepherding. They plan to use the thrift store as a primary funding source for these services, with a goal of the store covering approximately 75% of its operating costs, with the remaining support coming through donations and the community. Dave also highlighted The Well's Work Program, which provides an onsite work environment where individuals can experience transformation through paid employment, education, and mentorship. The program is designed to help participants develop skills, stability, and a pathway toward greater independence.
